

2010 World Series..... *Finally!*

After years of knocking on the door of the AABC National World Series, the Albany Athletics program finally broke through in 2010.

The team captured its first ever North Atlantic Regional title enroute to its first World Series berth in Houston, Texas last August capturing the excitement of fans, friends, and especially the Albany Twilight League. Many watched the games from their home computers as the Athletics games streamed live on the World Series web site. The league had finally sent a team to the World Series for the first time since the 1989 Apex Printing team, and furthermore, the Athletics were only the third Twilight team in the league's 80-year history to have made it to a Stan Musial World Series.

REGULAR SEASON

Traditionally, the League pits the previous year's champion and runner up against each other to kick off the Twilight season. In 2010, the defending champion Athletics opened with runner up Nolan Propane for the second straight season and had somewhat of the same result. A's starter Jim Shook twirled a no-hitter and fanned 13 batters while Justin Meagher hit a three-run double to help Albany start the regular season with a 3-0 win on the League's Opening Night for the fourth season in a row. However, the A's went on to win just two of their next four games to begin the year 3-2—a far cry from the traditional fast start they are used to. However, a short two-game losing streak in the first five games sparked the team to win 16 straight league games and close 20-4 in the league regular season. They also finished 29-7-1 overall.

Along the way Albany put up a gaudy offensive numbers and kept opponents to three runs or less 29 times in all regular season games including losses. Heading into the postseason, the A's had recorded 13 shutouts including a streak of five consecutive shutouts at one point and eight out of nine games.

A highlight during the regular season came when the A's shutout the Albany Dutchmen of the Perfect Game Collegiate League 3-0 in the annual Mayor's Trophy game which pits the Dutchmen against the League's previous year's champion. Dan Barbero hit a first inning two-run homer while Shook fanned 13 batters and hurled a complete game.

TWILIGHT PLAYOFFS

For the 5th consecutive year the A's finished with the most wins in the league and earned the #1 seed in the playoffs for the 4th time since 2006. They nearly swept through the playoffs losing only one playoff game—the first playoff loss since the 2008 season.

In the ATL Semifinal Series, Albany swept its best-of-three series over #4 seeded Blue Slate Bluehawks 1-0 in game #1 and 3-0 in game #2 on back-to-back nights with Shook and left hander Chris Smith earning wins each night. The A's scored its lone run in game #1 on a wild pitch. A day later, they got a two-run homer from Al Barbato to spark the offense in game #2.

In the Championship Series, the A's fell 5-0 in game #1 immediately following their return from Houston, but bounced back to sweep the next three. In game #2, Barbero hit a grand slam to spark a 12-run fifth inning to help the A's win 20-10. In game #3, Casey Walsh struck out 10 and John Marcella hit a two-run homer to help the Athletics to an 8-1 victory. In the clincher, Barbato and Sean Donovan homered to lead the offense in an 8-5 win and the A's fourth league championship. Barbato was the playoff MVP for going 9-for-21 with 6 RBI in the semis and finals. The Athletics won their second straight title and upped their playoff record to 22-4 in the ATL playoffs going back to 2006.

AABC POSTSEASON

By winning the ATL regular season, the Athletics earned a BYE past the AABC Upper New York State Tournament and went straight to their 10th North Atlantic Regional Tournament since 1998. The Twilight League hosted the event and the stage was set for a historic Regional tournament at Keenholts Park in Guilderland. Perennial power Long Island Storm was making its 14th consecutive Regional appearance and was fresh off a 3rd place finish in the Stan Musial World Series in 2009 and previously won the national championship in 2006. They were the team to beat once again and the A's set their sights on facing them to determine the 2010 champ.

In the first round, Jason Martin and Barbato went deep for homers igniting a 7-3 victory over the New Jersey South champion, Buena Vista Tomahawks. Zach Halloran doubled twice and drove in a run while rookie Matt Montross threw a complete game three-hitter. In the second round against the New Jersey North champion, North Haledon Reds, Martin singled in a run and doubled in two runs to account for all of Albany's offense in a 3-0 victory.

With just four teams remaining in the tournament heading into the third round, the A's and Storm were the only 2-0 teams in the tournament. They would play a pivotal game, one that would also help determine a bye in the fourth round. Despite the A's spotting the Storm a 2-0 lead after one inning, Barbato erased the deficit with a two-run shot in the third inning then Meagher blasted a two-run homer in the fifth inning to lead the A's to a 4-3 victory. Walsh threw a complete game striking out five and propelling Albany to a 3-0 record in the tournament and a bye to the championship game.

A's Have Historic Year Winning Regional title

Later in the day the Storm eliminated North Haledon to set the stage for a rematch in the championship. Long Island defeated the Athletics 3-2 in 10 innings despite a complete game seven-hitter by Shook forcing a second championship game.

In the decisive game of the Regional, the A's finally prevailed by an 11-7 margin to capture their first Regional crown and advance to the National World Series in Houston. In the first inning, Martin singled in a run and Mike Zgorzelski smacked a three-run homer to spark a five-run inning to start the game. But a 5-0 lead didn't last long as the Storm put four runs across in the bottom of the first and second innings to make it 5-4. Martin and Barbero then hit solo homers in the third and Albany opened up an 8-5 lead by the fifth inning. The Storm closed the gap again to make it 8-7 until Martin laced a two-run single in the sixth opening up the lead once again. Chris Smith came on in the fifth to retire two batters in relief of starter Andrew Mondo, then Shook relieved Smith to close down the Storm and lead the A's to victory. Martin went an astounding 10-for-16 with 10 RBI and three home runs in the tournament while Shook was 2-1 with 15 strikeouts in 16.2 innings. Both shared co-MVP honors.

NATIONAL WORLD SERIES – HOUSTON, TEXAS

Slightly more than 48 hours later, a team of 21 players and two coaches took flight to Houston for the National World Series at Baseball USA. The team opened its first ever game against a team west of the Mississippi at 4 pm against the Dallas Royals—the South Plains winner. It was evident the 104 degree heat was a factor early on with the A's falling behind 2-0 then 4-2 after two innings, but Meagher doubled in a pair of runs in to knot the game at 4-4 in the bottom of the second inning. However, it wasn't until the sixth inning that the game was untied with Martin slamming a three-run shot, Zgorzelski hitting a solo shot and Joe DeMarco finishing the scoring of an eight-run rally with a three-run double. Walsh threw a nine-inning complete game and retired 22 straight hitters after the second inning. The A's finished with a 13-5 victory and its first World Series win.

Unfortunately, the ride was about to end as the Athletics faced 2009 National Champion, the Bayamon Vaqueros of Puerto Rico. Despite a solid pitching outing by Shawn Ryan and a pair of singles each for Barbero and John Marcella, Albany fell 6-0 to Bayamon.

In the losers bracket, the A's faced perennial East Central powerhouse Canton Stallions. Martin and Zgorzelski helped the A's to an early 2-0 lead but thanks to a pair of two-run home runs, the Stallions took a 4-3 lead heading into the ninth inning. In the ninth, Greg Sulz hit a pinch-hit single, moved to second on a sacrifice bunt, then scored on a single by Barbero to tie it at 4-4 to push the game into extra innings. In the bottom of the tenth, Canton hit a two-run home run to dash any hopes the Athletics had of winning a national championship in their first World Series. The Stallions would use that victory to springboard to three straight wins in the Series and the 2010 National Championship over Bayamon.





2010 WORLD SERIES

2011 Set On National Title

Pitching is deep, hitting improved from 2010 World Series team

The Albany Athletics got a taste of it last year for the first time—what it feels like to contend for a national championship. When the 2010 team returned from Houston last August, it knew it wasn't far from being the best team in the country. The A's of a year ago showed they belonged in Houston competing for a World Series title.

The 2011 team will look to build on that World Series appearance and raise its benchmark for success beyond Regional accomplishments. Is the 2011 version improved in pitching and hitting enough to sustain reaching its goal?

PITCHING

Two-time Twilight League Pitcher of the Year **Jim Shook** (*Philmont, NY/Columbia Greene CC*) returns as the most dominant pitcher in A's history. Shook set a Twilight record last year with 104 strikeouts and was Regional co-MVP. He is joined by right-handed stud **Casey Walsh** (*Ithaca, NY/UAlbany*) who was as much of a "go-to" guy in 2010 as Shook. Walsh was the only Athletic in 2010 to go 3-0 in three postseason starts including the A's World Series win. Lefthander **Chris Smith** (*Colonie, NY/Oneonta*) returns and is expected to build on four wins from a year ago and take on a bigger role for Albany. Other returnees include righthanders **Bill Lawton** (*Watervliet, NY/Wofford*), **Shawn Ryan** (*Stillwater, NY/UAlbany*), **Matt Simone** (*Niskayuna, NY/Binghamton*) and **James Pacifico** (*Leeds, NY/Siena*). Pacifico is a former League Pitcher of the Year and provided a gritty eight-inning performance against World Series champion Canton last year. Lawton was a League All-Star and has won numerous State tournament

games dating back to 2002. Ryan is known for blossoming late in the season and being a weapon as a starter or out of the bullpen. Simone has played a dual role as a valuable relief pitcher and a first baseman and third baseman.

Two newcomers will join the staff this year: righthander **Steve Juedes** (*Schenectady, NY/Oneonta*) and lefthander **Ryan White** (*Saratoga Springs, NY/UAlbany*). Juedes is a proven ace in the Twilight League having pitched for two teams over the last several years. On a sub .500 Lansingburgh team, Juedes led the league in strikeouts in 2008 and returns to the league after Tommy John surgery. White meanwhile, is a hard throwing lefty and soon-to-be senior at UAlbany. He was a frontline pitcher for the Great Danes the last two spring seasons and will be highly valuable to the Athletics starting rotation and in closing situations as well.

CATCHING

Veteran **Craig Mastroianni** (*Colonie, NY/Hudson Valley CC*) leads the trio of catchers. Mastroianni is a former Twilight League All Star and returns for his fifth season. **Joe DeMarco** (*Clifton Park, NY/Saint Rose*) will return for his second year and will be a contributor as a catcher and outfielder in 2011. Newcomer **Justin Harris** (*Albany, NY/Pfeiffer*) joins the A's as one of the most highly touted recruits in the Capital District. Harris possesses a strong arm, excellent blocking skills and a bat that can supply power.

INFIELD/OUTFIELD


The 2011 infielders and outfielders may be the most experienced and versatile the A's have ever seen.

Returning League All Star and World Series All Tournament player **Jason Martin** (*Bloomington, NY/UAlbany*) is expected to supply the power surge this year once again as a first baseman and designated hitter. Martin was nearly impossible to get out in the postseason last year going 11-for-18 in the Regionals and collecting five more hits and six RBI in the World Series. Martin is joined by 2010 League MVP **Mike Zgorzelski** (*Latham, NY/Cortland*), 2009 League MVP **Justin Meagher** (*Latham, NY/*

UAlbany) and 2007 League MVP **Dan Barbero** (*Albany, NY/Hudson Valley CC*). After 7 years in the league, Zgorzelski captured his first MVP award last year and will be expected to reload his bat this year primarily as a third baseman. Meagher is a perennial league All Star utility player and can be outstanding at any position on the field. He is also a threat to hit for power and steal bases at any time. Barbero, an infielder and designated hitter, may be the most prolific hitter in A's history with multiple All Star awards and significant power figures annually. He also holds the A's record for most consecutive games played (160) in an A's uniform.

All-Star second baseman **Al Barbato** (*Utica, NY/UAlbany*) and power hitting shortstop **Zach Halloran** (*Albany, NY/UAlbany*) will return to the infield. Barbato led the league in homeruns in 2010 and hit a bunch more in the postseason to provide power, excellent defense and speed. Halloran was the team's shortstop on the ride to the World Series last year and brought a new energy to the club as a rookie. As a second year player, he will be expected to play short and third base in 2011 and come through in big offensive situations. Brothers **Nick** (*Rotterdam, NY/Mt. Olive*) and **Ben Paniccia** (*Rotterdam, NY/Saint Rose*) return this year. Nick was the team's starting shortstop from 2006 through 2009 before taking the 2010 season off. He is expected to bring back his leadership and clutch hitting to the 2011 team either in the middle infield or third base. Ben, meanwhile, is a natural first baseman but has adapted to be one of the top defensive outfielders in the league. A hard-nosed player between the lines, he will also be expected to provide power at the plate. Utility player **Brett Weber** (*East Greenbush, NY/Saint Rose*) will return to provide versatility on defense and as a professional part-time hitting instructor, his array of knowledge will be valuable to provide to teammates.

John Marcella (*Guilderland, NY/Saint Rose*) is the team's longest tenured player and returns to man the centerfield position for the 6th straight year. Marcella is a speedy, power hitter and rarely makes mis-cues in the outfield. In recent years, he's



made clutch plays in numerous postseason games cementing his legacy as one of the best outfielders the team's ever had.

Newcomer **Leo Corvino** (*East Greenbush, NY/Albany*) joins the A's as a seasoned Twilight veteran. Corvino has played just about every position, including pitcher, over the last six years primarily for All Stars Academy. He'll be a starting outfielder this year for the A's and be available to play infield when needed. Another newcomer, **JP Sportman** (*Schenectady, NY/Central Connecticut*) will man an outfield or infield position as well. Sportman is just a college sophomore who plays an aggressive, fast style of offense and defense and has a major league arm. He could potentially hit in any spot in the lineup.

2011 SCHEDULE

Once again, the Athletics will take on its 24-game league schedule at Bleecker Stadium starting on the league's Opening Night on May 13th. After a pair of teams folded following the 2010 season, the league has approved the charter for two new franchises.

Beyond its league slate, the A's have loaded up with numerous non-league affairs including the annual Mayor's Trophy in June pitting the defending Twilight Champions against the Perfect Game Collegiate League's Albany Dutchmen.

The A's will also host the 12th annual Baseball Fest in late June at Central Park's A, B, C diamonds. Albany has invited seven other teams to the round robin event including Oriskany, Philly, Rockland, Sullivan and the Thunder. Other non-league opponents include the 2009 Regional Champion Long Island Storm as well as the Tri-County Bees, CD Cannons, and Frozen Ropes Outlaws.

Following the conclusion of the regular season in late July, the A's will aim to make its unprecedented 14th consecutive AABC postseason. With the Twilight League hosting the North Atlantic Regional Tournament in August, Twilight teams will all be aiming for the league's regular season title which will earn them a BYE past the State tournament and automatically into the Regionals. The A's have won an Upper New York State record nine State Championships since 1998. Beyond the Regional tournament, Al-

bany has high hopes to advance and return to the AABC National World Series in Houston, Texas.

PARTNERSHIP

For the 7th straight year, the A's will partner with Pine Bush Little League and Guilderland Babe Ruth to host youth baseball camps and assist with the program's travel teams. The A's are gracious to partner with both groups to not only contribute back to the community but also utilize the camp revenues to offset season expenses.

2011 PREVIEW



Joe Altieri - #17

Head Coach/ General Manager

Head Coach and General Manager Joe Altieri returns to the helm of the Albany Athletics program for his 16th year. He began his tenure in 1996--one year after graduating from the College of Saint Rose.

Since 1996, he has erected his franchise to one of the top summer programs in the northeast using an aggressive approach to recruiting and developing a schedule of more games than most NCAA-sanctioned leagues around the country.

During his tenure as head coach, Altieri has led his teams to nine Upper New York State Championships--the most State titles by any single team in Upper New York State--and last year the team finally broke through the Regional tournament for a berth in the AABC National World Series in Houston. Last year's team was the first Twilight League team to reach the World Series since the late 1980's. It finished 5th nationally with a win over Dallas in the opening round. The 2010 Athletics did so even after dropping the opener of a five-game series one day after getting off a flight from Houston. It was their second straight League Championship and fourth in five years. Then returned home to drop the opener of a five-game League Championship Series but swept three games to win their second straight league title and fourth in five years.

In 2009, the team enjoyed another year of success with another record--four straight State titles--and a third place finish in the Regional tournament.

Over a 15-year period, Altieri has amassed 492 overall wins in 701 games and has helped his team win more league games since 1998 than any other current team in the Twilight League. His total is now at 212 wins in the Twilight League alone including 20-win seasons in the league in 2001, 2007, 2009, and 2010. His teams have also been highly successful in the postseason as well compiling an astounding 42-11 State Tournament record and a 27-19 mark in Regional Tournaments.

The tradition of the Albany Athletics has been built as a winner since 1996 when Altieri first took over the team following his hiring by St. Louis Cardinals scout and team owner, Joe Vellano.

Altieri and Vellano ran the Athletics, then known as the Electric City Giants, in the eight-team Mountains Collegiate League where a league title was an immediate feat Altieri helped bring to the team. The Giants went 33-10 in his

second season (1997) enroute to an MCL title. The following season he applied the franchise for membership in the Twilight League under the team's new name of the Albany Senators. Membership was accepted and his team made an immediate impact with an unexpected run through the League and State Tournament to capture its first Upper New York State championship going 33-14 overall in 1998.

The 1998 season concluded with Albany reaching the North Atlantic Regional and placing third. The Upper New York State region voted Altieri as the American Amateur Baseball Congress Manager of the Year out of 216 other coaches. Following a string of successful years with several more State crowns, the team eventually became the Albany Athletics in 2002 and today is known as one of the premier programs in amateur baseball.

Beyond his head coaching duties, Altieri also is the General Manager handling several other responsibilities including recruiting, team publicity, fundraising/sponsorships, scheduling and organizing the annual Albany Athletics Baseball Fest. He is also the Camp Director of Rising Star Baseball Camp--a platform used to teach fundamentals to local youth players and create a stream of revenue to fund the team.

In 2005, he also initiated the efforts to get some of the team's games broadcast on the Internet live--the first Twilight League team to accomplish that.

The Twilight League appointed Altieri the League Publicity Director in 2001, the Treasurer in 2010, and also voted him the AABC Tournament Director for State and Regional Tournaments every time the Twilight League hosts a postseason event. In 2006, the AABC of Upper New York appointed him as the Deputy Commissioner of the Upper New York State region which assists in the management and interpretation of rules and membership in Stan Musial baseball in upstate New York.

The Guilderland High School graduate spent his playing days at Saint Rose where he hit over .300 his senior campaign as an infielder for two NCAA II Northeast Regional teams. Further, Altieri spent three seasons in the Twilight League ending his career with Davies AC after hitting .308 his final season.

Following the skipper's playing days, his former college coach Bob Bellizzi, hired Altieri to resurrect the Junior Varsity baseball program at the College. Over a five-year period Altieri amassed a 60-48-1 career record strengthening the program before his departure in 2001. Additionally, he spent the 2003-04 year as an assistant in SUNY Cobleskill's baseball program and spent 2004-05 as a

John returns to the Athletics for his third year as a coach in the program.

He was previously the Athletic's starting second or third basemen from 2002-2005 and a major part of two championship runs over that time. Last year he was instrumental in helping guide the A's to their first World Series appearance and continue its dominance in the Twilight League. He led the program in a rare absence of Coach Altieri and strengthened moral and character in the program. Coach Kelly was also assisted in the mentoring of younger players coming into the program each of the last two years.

Under Coach Altieri, John was a consistent contributor for more than four seasons. He has accumulated nearly 400 at bats as an Athletic and drove in 43 runs while scoring nearly 70 runs over 174 games.

In 2004, John was the Athletics Baseball Fest MVP going 6-for-10 with six RBI in four games leading the A's to a tournament title. He is a two-time Coaches Award recipient and was always a well-liked teammate. He was a big part of two State championship teams and two teams who finished as runner up in the State tournament.

As the starting third baseman at Schenectady Community College, John hit .391 and earned second team All-Region honors in 2002. Once again, this year John will be an important cog to the coaching staff. Aside from sharing his championship experiences, he will handle first base coaching duties and work with hitters. He has also established himself as a recruiter in the local baseball circles assisting Coach Altieri in the signing of players. This fall he will spend his second October as part of the Athletics evaluation team who look at 13, 14, and 15 year old players at Guilderland Babe Ruth travel team tryouts.

Bill comes to the Athletics for his sixth season as an assistant coach and his ninth season as a pitcher in the team's rotation.

Despite a drop off in innings last year, Bill proved he was still a valuable arm in the A's rotation going 3-0 with a 3.68 ERA in 38 innings. In 2009, he was 7-2 with 46 strikeouts and a 1.67 ERA in 56.1 innings. He was one of two Athletics pitchers to hold a spot on the league's All Star team which only recognizes the top three pitchers. Bill also threw a complete game shutout in the State tournament semifinals giving him his third career win in four state tournament starts.

His success in the postseason was again evident in 2008 when he threw 6.1 innings in the State championship game leading the club to a 3-2 victory. Less than five days later Bill started a second round game in the North Atlantic Regional going deep into the game to earn another postseason win. Prior to 2006, Bill last played with the Athletics in 2002 and 2003 and helped hurl the Athletics to another State title when he pitched five innings in the championship game in 2003 enroute to his first postseason win.

Bill is one of a few Athletics players who brings professional playing experience to the club. He spent three seasons with the Albany-Colonie Diamond Dogs of the Northeast League following an outstanding college career at Wofford College and at Gloucester Community College where he was named an All-Region pitcher. At Gloucester, he broke the school's record for appearances (26) in a season.

His professional career saw him enjoy three successful seasons as a starter for the Diamond Dogs including an 8-8 year in 1999 when the Dogs won the Northern League title. That year Bill racked up 90.2 innings, 70 strikeouts and a 4.17 ERA in 12 starts. The following year he compiled a 5-4 record, 37 strikeouts and a 3.82 ERA in 75 innings.

He gives private pitching lessons in the offseason and is part of the Athletics evaluation team for the Guilderland Babe Ruth 13, 14, and 15 year old travel team tryouts each fall season.

Mark returns to the program for the first time as a player-coach. Two years ago he joined the coaching staff for a brief stint but was unable to stay in the Albany area for the summer.

Mark is the A's career leader in walks (150) and stolen bases (84). He accumulated those key statistics as the starting centerfielder for the Athletics from 2000-2004. He helped lead the A's to four State Championships and several Twilight division titles during that time and has now accumulated 214 games with the team. In 2002, Mark was named Baseball Fest MVP when the team captured its 4th Fest title.

Last year in his debut as a Twilight League Head Coach, Mark led All Stars Academy to its first division title and first State Championship with an 18-6 league mark. It was All Stars best season in team history.

Prior to returning to the Capital Region, Mark played and coached in professional baseball following an outstanding collegiate career at Frostburg State University where he hit .375 in 44 games his senior year in 2003. At Frostburg, Mark holds a .324 career batting average, a school record 101 walks and helped lead FSU teams to two conference runner up finishes.

In the pros, he was an outfielder for the Kansas City T-Bones and Texarkana Gunslingers before spending a season as an Assistant Coach with Texarkana (2008).

He was also Assistant Athletic Director, Assistant Varsity Coach, and Head JV Coach at Garrett College for a year following three years as the head of recruiting at Frostburg State. At Frostburg, Mark was also responsible for hitting instruction and game management duties. Mark, who was recently inducted into the Shaker High School Sports Hall of Fame, is currently a professional hitting instructor at All Stars Academy and has instructed at dozens of camps in the Northeast since 2004. He resides in Latham and has a son Jaxon.
